

Sports Premium

The Department for Education is spending over £450 million on improving Physical Education (PE) and Sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. Each primary school will receive an allocation of funding based on the number of pupils within the school.

Playing sport helps to keep people healthy and is good for communities. Playing sport at school or in a local club is also the first step to competition at the highest level, which helps improve our reputation as a sporting nation, and contributes to economic growth. But when people leave school they often stop playing sports, which means people can't fulfill their sporting potential, and can lead to a less healthy lifestyle. The government wants to get more people playing sport safely from a young age, and help them keep playing sport throughout their life, no matter what their economic or social background. The DfE funding is to encourage as many people as possible to play sport and develop an active and healthy lifestyle.
