

Guiding Principles of the Partnership

- To lead and co-ordinate the development of high quality sport, PE and competition in the Cluster Primary Schools
- To offer students the opportunity to play, learn and lead together across the Cluster
- To maintain and enhance the strengths of the Cluster partnership

Success Criteria

- Leadership structures for PE and sport are in place within schools and across the cluster
- A balanced calendar of events is created for the year in line with L2 and L3 games
- More children participate in inter school competitions
- Young leaders are actively involved in the organisation of intra and inter school events
- All events are communicated in a timely manner via the Head and the PLT
- Opportunities are equally offered across both clusters

Model of delivery

- Total of three PE teacher days per week
- One teacher release day for each Cluster per week
- One day per week across both Clusters to lead and co-ordinate the partnership
- Steering Group will lead, monitor and review the delivery and impact of the partnership through calendared meetings
- EWS will provide facilities and Leaders. SSCO contracts and payment arrangements will be made through EWS systems.

Cost

- £22,800 to be split equally between the 13 Cluster Schools
- Invoices to be paid in full by 30th November 2014

Commitment

- Organise and quality assure all School Games inter-school competitions (incl KS1)
- Coordinate three PLT meetings and CPD as separate clusters/with one joint across the year
- Working alongside teachers on CPD of PE and Sport, broker in-school support where needs are identified by the Cluster
- Signpost for and support the recruitment of high quality coaches for extra-curriculum clubs
- Train young leaders in playground lunchtime activities using the EWS Leadership Academy structure
- Train young leaders to lead and officiate Level 1 competitions through the EWS Leadership Academy structure
- Support Intra school competitions through the EWS Leadership Academy (incl KS1)
- Provide support to schools at Level 1 District School Games competitions

The EWS Sports Partnership



- Organise leaders from EWS to lead and officiate Level 1 District competitions
- Deliver taster sessions for some Level 2 School Games events using EWS facilities and leaders
- Coordinate/distribute relevant funding, programmes, resources, club/NGB opportunities
- Support the completion of Kitemark applications
- Support the effective use of the School Games website
- Inform, support and provide opportunities for inclusive PE and sport through the Project Ability
