Mathematics

Children will look at:

Reception:

- Counting and number recognition
- Addition and subtraction
- Ordering by length, height, weight and capacity

Year 1:

- Addition and subtraction to 20
- Place value within 20
- Counting in 2s 5s and 10s
- Measuring length, height, weight and volume

Music

To listen to music with concentration and understanding
To use voices expressively and creatively.
Selecting and combine sound to create a sound journey.

Geography

- To use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the UK and its countries, as well as the 7 continents.
- To identify the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles.
- To identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK. To understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of our local area and that in Mexico City.

English – Reading, Writing, Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

The children will also have daily phonics, spelling and handwriting lessons.

- Reading and enjoying a range of texts – fiction, non-fiction and poetry.
- Sequencing stories
- Writing short stories
- Using a non-fiction text to retrieve information
- Writing a fact book
- Labelling animals
- Writing recounts
- Performing and writing poetry
- Adding –er and –est to an adjective
- Adding –s and –es to a noun
- Adding –ing and –ed to a verb

Science

- To ask simple questions and gather and record information to answer them
- To observe closely
- To identify, name and classify different animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and animals.
- To identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores
- To observe changes across the 4 seasons. To observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.
